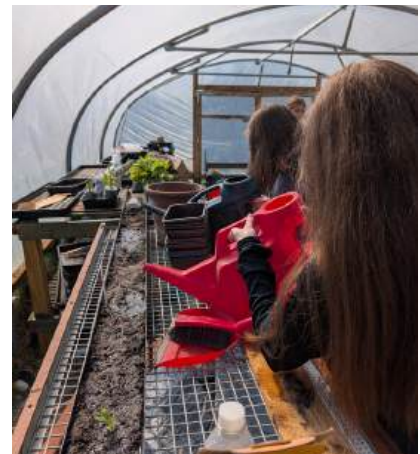


BBG BULLETIN

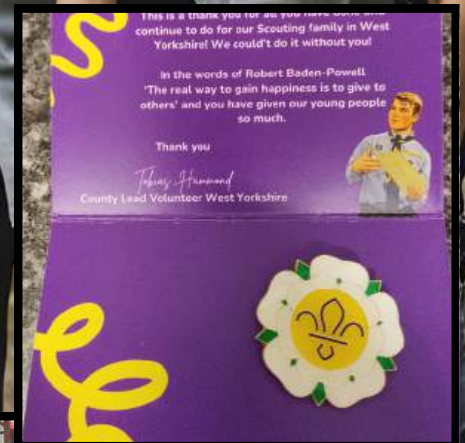

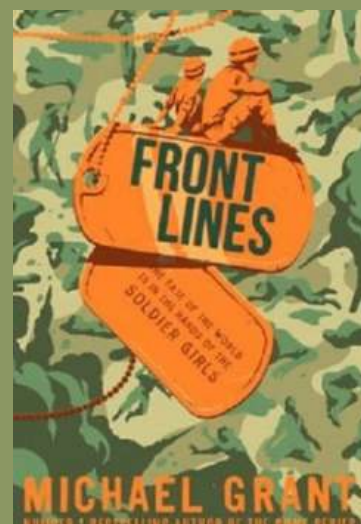


YEARS 9 AND 10

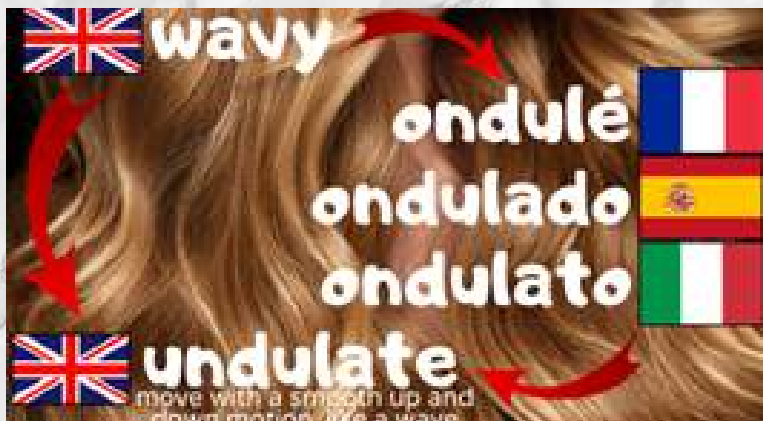

WORD LINKS BETWEEN FRENCH AND ENGLISH



Roman Days of Nimes, France (24-26 April)

For a weekend in April, Roman legionaries, an imperial court, riders and battle chariots take over the city of Nîmes to take part in one of the biggest re-enactments of ancient history in Europe.

Over 500 actors and extras from all over France, Italy and Germany participate in the event. A grandiose spectacle lasting an hour -and-a-half takes place in the arena on Saturday and Sunday afternoon. Each year, the Great Roman Games has a different theme and depicts a highlight of ancient history. Several scenes unfold with equestrian vaulting demonstrations, gladiatorial combat and chariot racing.

2,000 years after its construction, Nîmes amphitheatre's original beauty has remained intact, with room for up to 24,000 spectators.

Year 9 have started coasts and their transformation along the shoreline of the UK. This is progressively getting worse; creating problems for property owners and landowners, losing large amounts of money.

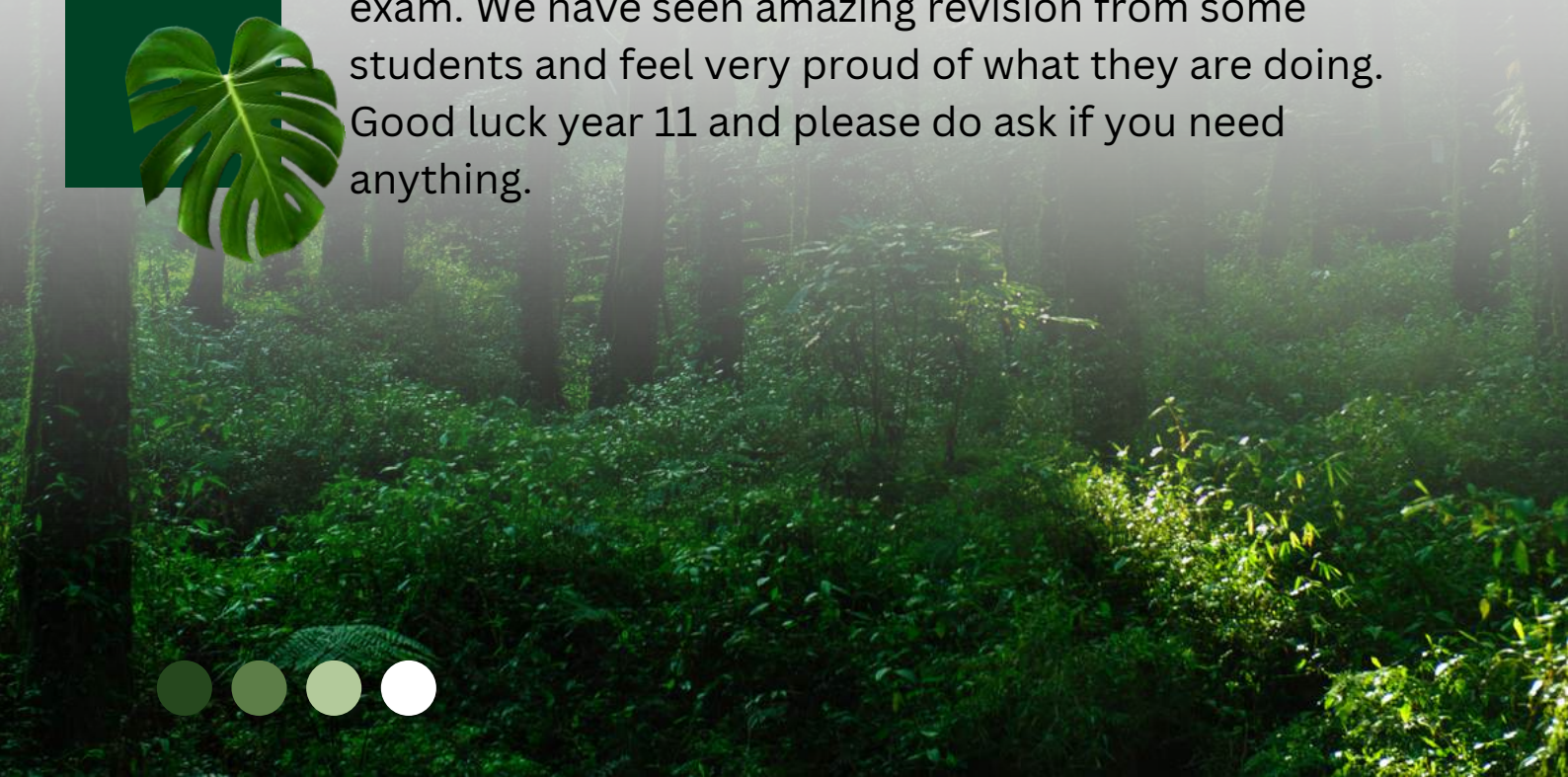

Slow down

General signs of a scam are:

- If It's too good to be true, then it probably is!
- Act now! - pressure or urgency to share details
- An unfamiliar company or logo
- Unusual URL links e.g.bit/inst123
- Misspelt words

3 Steps to protect your personal information

Organisations who help victims

- Your bank (they never ask you to share passwords or one-time passcodes)
- Your mobile phone provider
- 'Report Fraud' is the website for reporting all fraud to the police
- Cifas (offers a Protective Registration for victims of fraud for a fee)
- Victim Support

Use a strong password
Short phrase or three random words. Mix letters, characters and numbers

2

Use different passwords
Fraudsters try using stolen passwords across different accounts.

Set up multi factor authentication
Secure accounts with biometrics and a passcode sent via an email or text

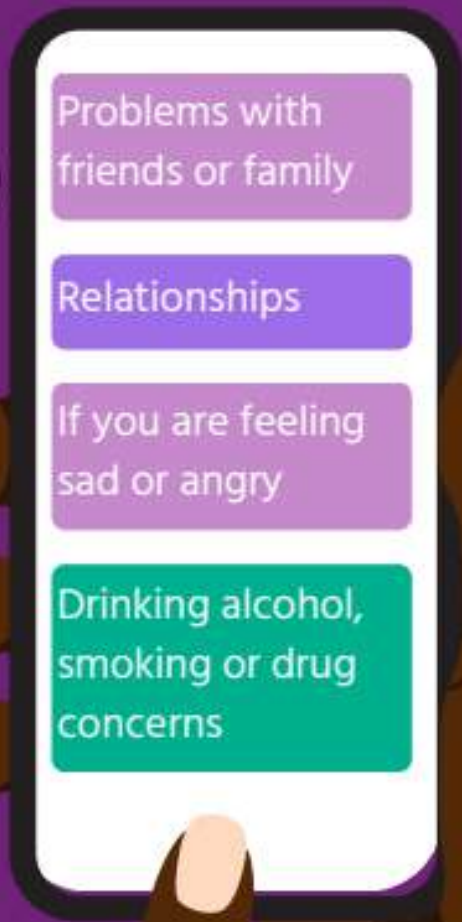

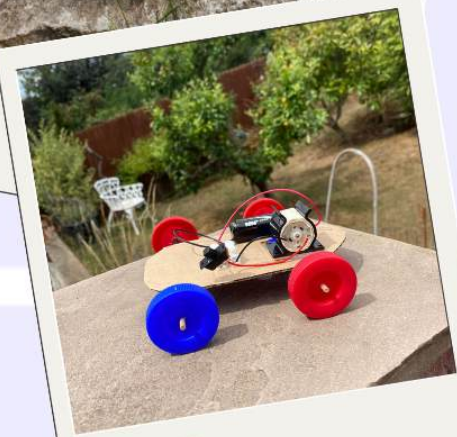
