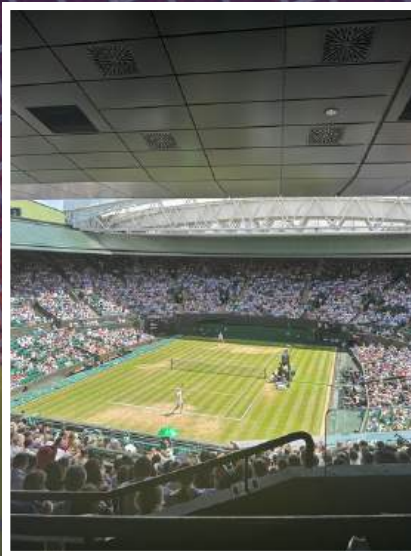

GROWING MINDS!

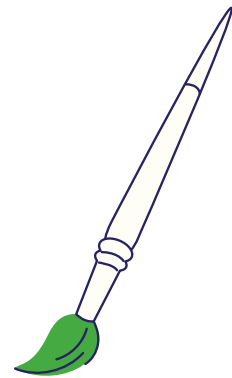

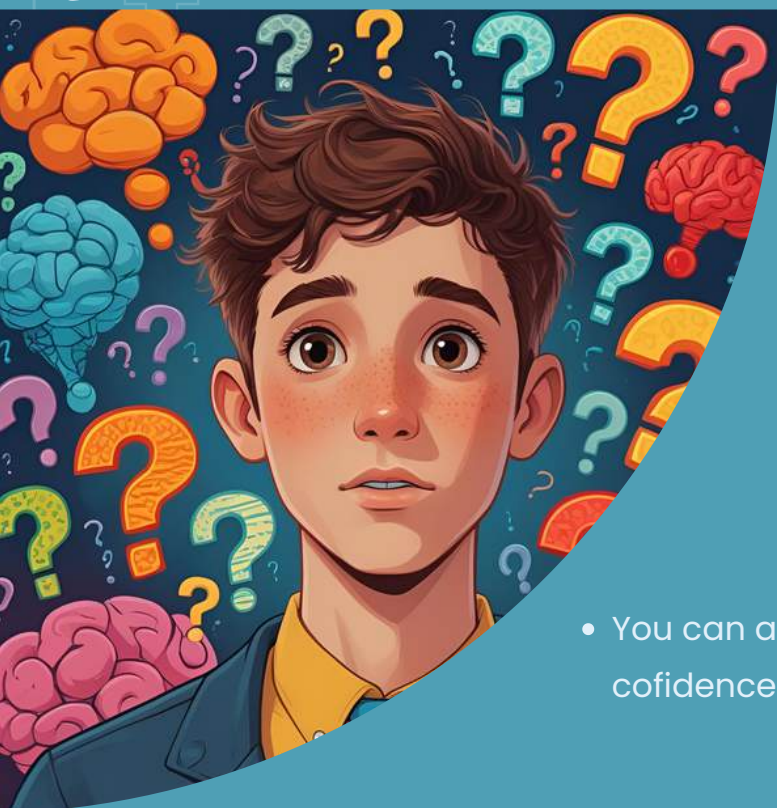

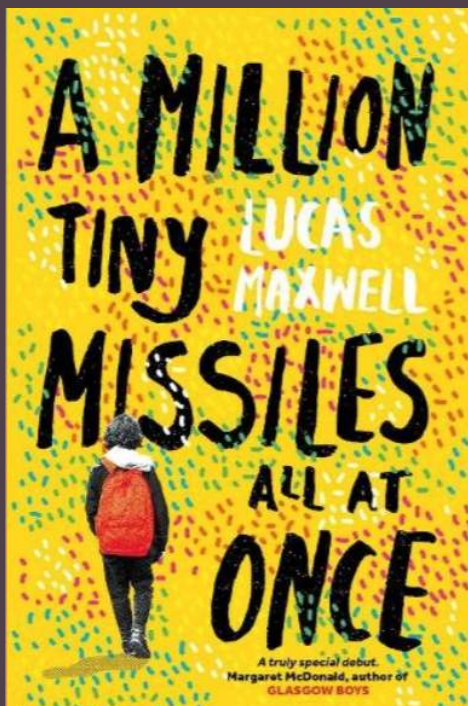
BOOKS OF THE MONTH

YEARS 7 AND 8

Being a teen's a tough gig, but what if one gig could save your family?

Elias's brain is a swamp of fears and bad things.

His once-loving brother Bo has become a stranger, and his parents are at breaking point. When Bo falls in with dangerous people, Elias decides he's the only one who can bring his family back together. But what begins as a simple pizza-night plan quickly spirals into chaos. Can Elias find a way to reach the people he loves the most before it's too late?



YEARS 9 AND 10

When Xavier wakes up on the first morning of an enforced family weekend away with his pregnant stepmum and dad, he doesn't recognise where they are - it's as if the house has inexplicably been transported to the set of a video game, inside an impenetrable dome where the family have been 'donated' chickens, goats, wheat to help them survive. There is no trace of their mysterious captors and no way to escape.

Three years later, he's sixteen and resigned to life without the internet, other people, let alone a girlfriend... when suddenly another family appears, one with vastly contrasting political ideologies and priorities.





What are we learning this half term in French?

Year 8 : How to use question words, information questions with inversion, negation, the verb 'dormir', negation before a noun, adjective order, irregular feminine forms of adjectives, the sounds 'ai', 'oi', 'ch', 'c'.

Year 9 : Nouns and gender, the singular definite and indefinite articles, cognates and false friends, how to talk about hobbies and interests, the present tense of regular -er verbs, plural nouns, likes, dislikes and opinions, possessive adjectives, talking about animals, the verb 'avoir', the plural indefinite article, talking about life at school, talking about daily life.

History

This week our Year 9 students have commenced their studies on the First World War. In the coming lessons they will undergo enquiries such as ‘Why did the war last for so long?’ or ‘Why did men volunteer to fight in the war?’

This links into the wider content of Year 9 history, that being 20th Century Global History. During the year students will study, amongst other things, World War Two, The Cold War, and the fight for Civil Rights.

Historical Travelling

Whilst history can feel far removed in time and place, there are many places nearby that one could visit over the summer to bring the past to life.

Eden Camp: This World War Two museum is about 90 minutes from Birkenshaw and covers a wide range of topics, including prisoners of war and life on the home front.

York Cold War Bunker: This museum, by guided tour only, allows you to explore the realities of what would have happened if ‘the bombs’ had fallen on Yorkshire. Its close proximity to York means it can be part of a fantastic day out!

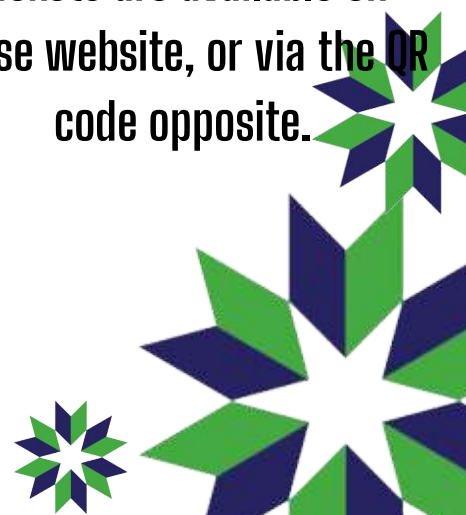

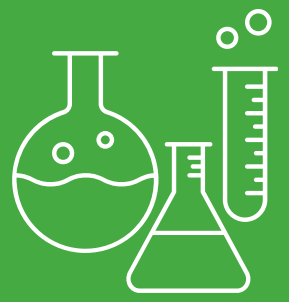

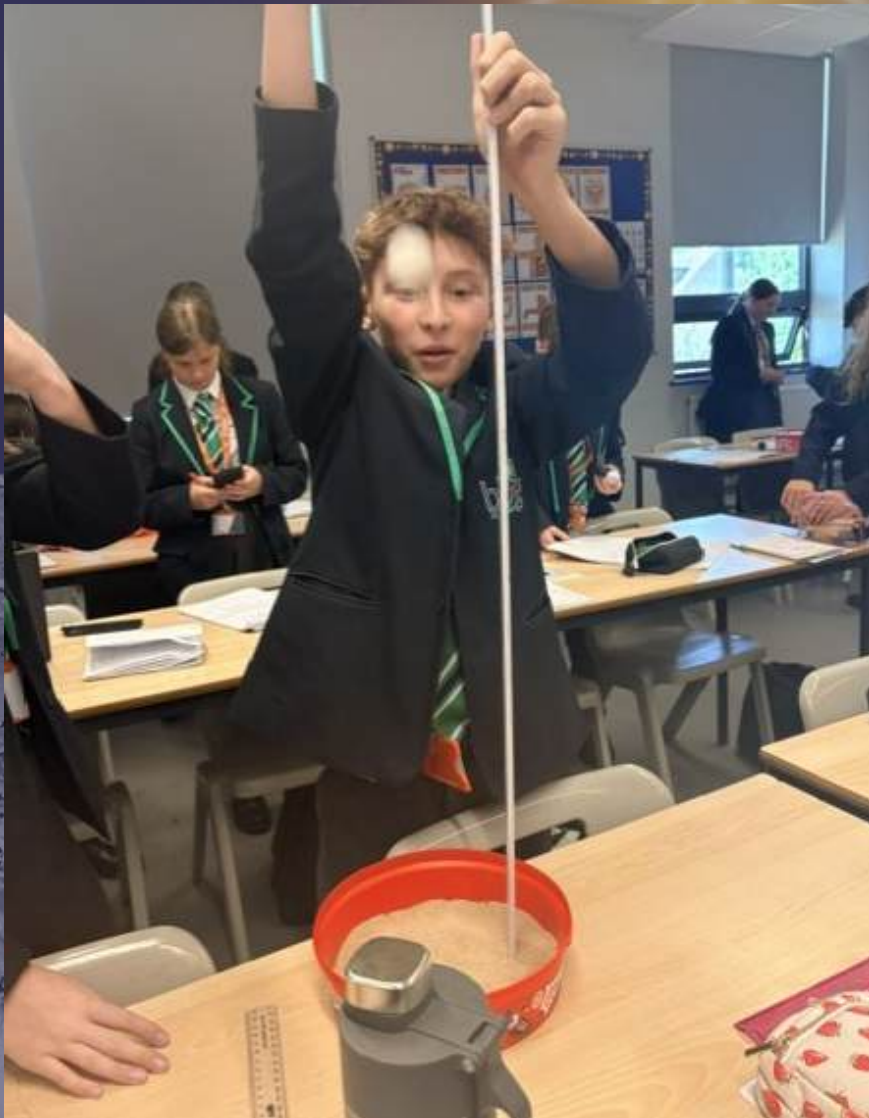


SCIENCE



This week, our students stepped into the shoes of NASA scientists to investigate the mysteries of the Moon! In their recent science sessions, the year group has been exploring how gravity and mass affect the formation of lunar craters.

To bring this space science down to Earth, students conducted a hands-on experiment using trays of fine sand and a variety of balls with different masses. By dropping the spheres from various heights, they simulated meteorites crashing into the Moon's surface.

Fraudsters are clever, but you're smarter



Suspect a scam message?

Slow down
Think it through
Overcheck
Pass it by someone you trust

General signs of a scam are:

- If It's too good to be true, then it probably is!
- Act now! - pressure or urgency to share details
- An unfamiliar company or logo
- Unusual URL links e.g. bit/inst123
- Misspelt words



3 Steps to protect your personal information

Organisations who help victims

- Your bank (they never ask you to share passwords or one-time passcodes)
- Your mobile phone provider
- 'Report Fraud' is the website for reporting all fraud to the police
- Cifas (offers a Protective Registration for victims of fraud for a fee)
- Victim Support

1

Use a strong password
Short phrase or three random words. Mix letters, characters and numbers

2

Use different passwords
Fraudsters try using stolen passwords across different accounts.

3

Set up multi factor authentication
Secure accounts with biometrics and a passcode sent via an email or text
